It is intended to instill character, the importance of civic engagement and patriotism among rising high school seniors.

When: June 12-18, 2022

Where: Grand Valley State University- Allendale, MI

Eligibility: Male high school juniors going into their senior

year in the fall of 2022.

**Application Deadline:** May 9, 2022 **Cost: \$25 Delegate Application Fee**

**Sponsor:** A sponsor can be an American Legion Post, Son of the American Legion Squadron, an American Legion Auxiliary Unit, but it can also be the boy's parents, a business owner, a school, or other organization like the Elks, Knights of Columbus, or a Moose club.

What: The American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program is a non-partisan, non-political mock government exercise in a model state designed to mirror the structure and operation of its respective state government. It is intended to instill character, the importance of civic engagement and patriotism among rising high school seniors.

When: June 12-17, 2022

Where: Virtual

**Eligibility**– Female high school juniors going into their senior year in the fall of 2022.

## Can Girls Play American Legion Baseball?

As the Department Programs Coordinator, I receive phone calls from individuals with a variety of questions. I can answer just about any question I get, or I can find an answer rather quickly. I was recently asked a question that I couldn't readily answer, it stumped me. What was the question; *can girls play American Legion Baseball?* 

This question led me first to our rule book, then National's rule book, and finally I decided to phone a friend at National. I was enlightened for several minutes before the conversation ended. The quick answer is, YES! Girls can play American Legion Baseball. Just like their counterparts, girls have been trying out and playing Legion Baseball for a while. They may not be in the majority but they are certainly present.

In my search for an answer, I came across a lady by the name of Margaret Gisolo, the "Girl Babe Ruth", and I was fascinated. Gisolo was born in 1914 and grew up the youngest of six children in Blanford, IN. She learned to play baseball with her brothers in a sandlot near her father's grocery store.

In 1928, Gisolo earned a spot on the roster of a newly created American Legion junior baseball team named the Blanford Cubs. At the time she was the only girl playing on *any* American Legion team. She played multiple infield positions and excelled as a base stealer, pitcher, and batter. Her involvement in baseball was low-key until a defeated rival team filed a complaint against her eligibility. Sportswriters across the country picked up the story, calling her the "Girl Babe Ruth". Long story short, after Legion officials consulted with MLB Commissioner Kenesaw Landis, it was decided to allow Gisolo to stay on the team and play for the remainder of the tournament.

Margaret Gisolo and her team won the Indiana state championship and went as far as the regional tournament in Chicago. She was a standout not just for her gender but for her impressive on the field abilities. Gisolo went on to play on a variety of other sports throughout her life. She graduated from Indiana State Teacher's College and was a Girls Scout director before joining the Navy WAVES during World War II. Gisolo passed away in 2009 at the age of 94 but her story still inspires other girls to follow their athletic dreams.

Unfortunately, in 1929, American Legion officials reversed their 1928 decision, effectively banning girls from playing legion baseball. Thankfully that decision came to an end sometime in the 1970's. Now, the American Legion Baseball program has one of the fairest rule books when it comes to allowing youth to play sports. Instead of taking the "no girls allowed" approach of the past, the American Legion lets talent determine who lands a spot on a team.

A simple Google search provides names of other young women making their mark on American Legion Baseball. Names like Donna Williams, Marti Sementelli, Emiko Phillips, and Rylee Kara, all baseball players who are paving the way for more young women to play American Legion Baseball.

Will your Post have an American Legion Baseball team this year? If so, will you encourage girls try out for your team? You should because you never know if it will be *your* team who has the next "Girl Babe Ruth".
