REMINDER: Eagle Scout \$1,000 Scholarship Applications Due March 1st

Boy scouts who are members of an American Legion, Department of Michigan post troop and have obtained the level of eagle scout or are the descendant of American Legion members may apply. The winner at the department level receives a \$1,000 scholarship and is advanced to the national level for consideration for Eagle Scout of the Year and a \$10,000 scholarship. Boys State and Student Trooper Update:

Boys State: The Boys State Committee met via Zoom on Wednesday, January 26th, to discuss the 2022 Boys State program. I am happy to report that they are going full steam ahead with plans for an IN-PERSON session at Grand Valley State University. As we get closer to June more information will be provided as to what restrictions/policies the Boys State attendees and staff will be required to follow by the university. All the high schools in Michigan have been mailed a copy of the Boys State application and a flyer so please reach out to your local high school to see if they have any young men in their junior class interested in attending Boys State in June.

Student Trooper: For the third consecutive year our partners at the Michigan State Police have decided to cancel all their youth programs for the summer. This means that there will be **NO** 2022 Student Trooper program in July. The State Police did discuss alternatives to the camp but ultimately they decided that none of the alternatives would provide the same experience as an in-person camp. With that said, we will be working on possible dates for the 2023 Student Trooper program and those will be announced in late September to early October of this year.

Membership Quick Tips From Department:

- Tip 1- If sending in a deceased member fill out and send in either the card or member data form, not both.
- Tip 2 It is easy to notify Department of deceased members or address changed if you simply email their ID# to member@michiganlegion.org.
- Tip 3- When filling in the DOB section on the card to be processed for membership, you need to provide the full date of birth not an abbreviated one. For example, 01-01-1922 (good one) 01-01-22 (not sufficient one because the year could be either 19 or 20).
- Tip 4- Mylegion.org doesn't provide the ability to update a member's continuous years. Posts will need to either provide the continuous years on a membership data form to Dept. or email member@michiganlegion.org.

Michigan Junior Shooting Sports

The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program is a gun safety education and marksmanship program that encompasses the basic elements of safety, education, enjoyment and competition. Shooters use the .177 caliber air rifle. Both males and females can participate, through Legion sponsorship; disabled youth are encouraged to join, as competitive shooting is a sport that creates an equal playing field for all competitors.

There is an annual 3-Position Junior Air Rifle National Championship which is a tournament that begins with postal matches. State and/or regional champions are determined and advance to a qualification round (also a postal match) to determine the athletes who will earn expense-paid trips to compete in the national championship. The national championship is a shoulder-to-shoulder match held each July at the USA Shooting range facilities at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. The American Legion, Department of Michigan has three junior shooting sports teams participating in the American Legion 3-Postion Junior Air Rifle Championship. Below is some information on our three teams that are participating in this years championship.

1. Grand Rapids Rifle & Pistol Club's Junior Rifle Team proudly sponsored by Roger B. Caffee Post 154 in Wyoming.



The team is coached by Cameron Zwart. The goal of their junior program is to provide all youth with the opportunity to participate in shooting sports, with an emphasis on three-position smallbore rifles, three-position air rifles, and international air rifles. No prior experience is required. All equipment is provided including guns, ammunition, and targets. The team participates in various local, regional, and national matches throughout the year.

This year, we have 32 athletes on the team. We have also placed first in the State during the National JROTC rifle competition (Sporter) in the 2018-19, 2019-20, and 2021-22 school years.

The New American Legion Brand Mark



(Indianapolis)-A new era of American Legion identity has begun.

The American Legion brand mark is now available for a variety of promotional uses – from social media channels to membership drives – and can be downloaded at www.legion.org/brand. The logo does not replace the 1919-patented official emblem of the organization, which remains in use for official documents, memorial observances, uniforms and post signage.

"The American Legion brand mark was created to modernize our image to appeal to a new generation of veterans," American Legion Chief Marketing Officer Dean Kessel said. "We launched this vivid new design on the American Legion-sponsored 48 car during the 2021 NTT INDYCAR Racing Series, and millions of fans got to see it every race. It's clear, sharp and effective, even at 225 mph. The design has gotten rave reviews, and now we are ready to advance it to all levels of The American Legion."

The American Legion Marketing Division has established guidance to help departments and posts choose when to use the brand mark and when the official emblem is more appropriate.

The <u>brand mark</u> is to be displayed in all marketing communications, such as:

- Advertising
- Lifestyle apparel (such as polo shirts and ball caps)
- Community service activities
- Fundraising
- Sponsorships
- Membership recruitment materials
- Digital media
- Social media
- Updated post signage
- Event announcements
- E-mail signature lines

The <u>American Legion emblem</u> is reserved for official organization communications, such as:

- Legal documents
- Policy statements
- Official reports
- Press releases
- Business cards
- Traditional post signage
- Financial documents
- Official letterhead

Kessel explained that brand marks are often successfully used to promote organizations and institutions that similarly have, and keep, time-honored seals, including all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces. The American Legion Marketing Division studied the effectiveness of those brand marks during a three-month design-development process that involved focus group input earlier in 2021.

"When it comes to communications for events, recruitment and other marketing functions, the brand marks of the military branches are most familiar and positively recognized by the public, the official seals less so," Kessel said. "This is fast proving true for The American Legion brand mark, which now appears on the national American Legion website, social media, e-newsletters and a growing number of promotional materials."

Like the emblem, the brand mark is legally protected property of The American Legion National Headquarters. Any use outside of the organization – such as merchandising, marketing by groups unaffiliated with The American Legion or at political events – is legally restricted and requires authorization from the national adjutant.

The same rules of permission to use the official emblem apply to the brand mark. Those rules, along with an online application form, can be found at www.legion.org/emblem/request on the national American Legion website.

"Just like the emblem, the new brand mark should never be used in political rallies for candidates or to promote organizations and events unassociated with The American Legion, without prior written authorization," Kessel said.

In the months ahead, new apparel, flags, signs and other materials adorned with the new brand mark will be available and promoted through Emblem Sales. The national portfolio of membership-recruitment media is also now being refreshed to display the new mark.
