Each year The American Legion Department of Michigan awards a Department Firefighter and Law Officer of the Year award, and we are looking to you for help in identifying one of each. Nominations are due by January 3, 2023, and evaluated by our Law and Order Chairperson. The firefighter and law officer chosen by the chairperson will be invited to the 2023 Annual Department Convention in July to receive their awards.

The Department selections will then be sent to The American Legion National Headquarters for consideration to receive the National Firefighter of the Year Award and the National Law Officer of the Year Award.

The American Legion supports our first responders; the last year and a half has been challenging for everyone, especially our first responders. This is a small way to say thank you and recognize a well-rounded Michigan Firefighter and Law Officer, who has exceeded, above and beyond, the duty requirements expected of their position and has demonstrated a distinct pattern of community service, or heroism, coupled with professional achievement over the past year.

\$500 Department Scholarships: The Brewer and Wilson High School Scholarships

The American Legion, Department of Michigan is offering twenty (20) scholarships to be awarded in the spring of 2023. There will be five (5) William D. and Jewell Brewer Scholarships in the amount of \$500 each and fifteen (15) Guy M. Wilson Scholarships in the amount of \$500 each. Criteria for the two scholarships differ and will be available only to students who meet the eligibility requirements for that scholarship. Selections are based upon academic performance, leadership quality, and basis of need.

<u>The William D. & Jewell Brewer \$500 Scholarship</u> is available to high school seniors or college students (with no bachelor's degree) planning to or are attending any nationally accredited college, university, or trade school in the Fall of 2023.

<u>The Guy M. Wilson \$500 Scholarship</u> is available only to high school seniors who are plan to attend any Michigan accredited college, university, or trade school in the Fall of 2023.

The following qualifications apply to both scholarships:

- Applicant must be a Michigan resident.
- Must be a direct descendant (child, step-child, grandchild or great-grandchild) of an honorably discharged veteran or active duty service member. Applicant must provide a copy of parent's, grandparent's, or great grandparent's discharge papers (DD-214 or equivalent) showing entry and discharge dates from honorable active military service. Eligible service dates are December 7, 1941 to present date. Please black out any social security number on the discharge papers. For descendants of active duty military servicemembers, a copy of the servicemembers current military identification card is required.
- Applicant is required to have a G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher and must provide a copy of their most recent transcript of grades signed by a school official. (A school official can be a teacher, counselor, or principal).
- Applicant must have a financial need for the scholarship. Applicant is required to provide a copy of the parent's most recently filed Federal Tax Form 1040 (both sides of the form are needed showing adjusted gross income and signature). If the applicant filed a Federal Tax Form 1040 and is 100% independent from parent's income, the applicant needs to provide a copy of their own Federal Tax Form 1040. Please black out any social security number on required tax forms.

Both scholarships are a one-time award and are not renewable.

Students may apply for either one or both of the scholarships, however, only one scholarship will be awarded per applicant.

The completed application and accompanying documents must be received at Department Headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on <u>January 3, 2023 (not post marked by).</u>

It's that time of year that all our programs in the American Legion have started. Some of our programs have the registration forms on our Department web site. The one I'm concerned with is the Eagle Scout of the year. I have found out through the Michigan Crossroads Council that 45 Posts sponsor Scouting. The requirements are at the end of this article. I know of only 35 Posts.

What I would like to see is, if a Post sponsors Scouting, it would be great if the Post has an Eagle Scout that they would be send a picture to the Media-Web Site Communications person, at Department Headquarters to be put in our Legion paper with a blip about their Eagle Project. As we all know, not every Eagle Scout is eligible for the Eagle Scout of the Year. I believe that every Eagle Scout should be recognized for their accomplishment in Scouting.

With over 650 Scouts, we do hope that this year we have some Eagle Scouts who qualify for this award. I would suggest to the Post Leadership to make a copy of the form, just in case a signature is missing so we can send it back to the Scouts parents or the Post Leadership. The deadline is March 1, 2023 for this award.

Department Eagle Scout Award \$1,000 National Eagle Scout Award \$10,000

The requirements are as follows:

THE NOMINEE MUST:

Be a registered, active member of a Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team, or Venturing Crew chartered to an American Legion post, American Legion Auxiliary unit or Sons of The American Legion Squadron.

OR

Be a registered, active member of a chartered Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team, or Venturing Crew, and the son or gradson of a Legionnaire, Sons of The American Legion or Auxiliary member.

AND

Received the Eagle Scout Award.

Be an active member of his religious institution and must have received the appropriate Boy Scout religious emblem.

Have demonstrated practical citizenship in church, school, Scouting, and community.

Have reached his 15th birthday and be enrolled in high school at the time of selection.

Reside in the department (state) to which he applies

Note: Eagle Scouts still in high school who reached their 18th birthday during the nomination year remain eligible if otherwise qualified.

Eagle Scout of the Year: Up to \$10,000 Scholarship!

American Legion, Department of Michigan Scouting program sponsors over 65 troops, packs, and crews in our American Legion posts. The Legion's support for Boy Scouts of America began at the Legion's first national convention in 1919. This is natural for Legionnaires, who bring their service-learned skills and experiences as veterans to help build character and positive traits in our country's youth. Few other post activities generate more goodwill from the community.

Eagle Scout of the Year: Applications Due March 1, 2023

The American Legion, Department of Michigan honors the Eagle Scout of the Year at the department convention. The winner of the competition receives a \$1,000 scholarship and is advanced to the national competition.

The American Legion annually honors the Eagle Scout of the Year at the national convention. The winner of the competition receives a \$10,000 scholarship, and the three runners-up are each awarded \$2,500 scholarships.

American Legion Square Knot Award: Award for Legion Family Members

The American Legion Square Knot award is given to American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, and Sons of the American Legion members who volunteer for their post-scouting program. More information and application can be found at www.legion.org/scouting/award

This award is designed to recognize American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion members who are actively involved in the Scouting program. This award is not meant to be a selective or limited award, but one that is available to any American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion member who completes the requirements for the award. The award is meant to recognize dedication and work required by an American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion member to assist in furthering the Scouting program in The American Legion.

Requirements are as follows: You must submit appropriate documentation (membership card, photocopies of course completion certificates, a narrative of accomplishments, etc.) in order to fully document the attainment of the requirements as outlined in sections A, B, C, and D of the checklist found on our website. Any application that is missing a requirement will be returned to the sender for correction and re-submission.

Documentation may be sent at any time, awards are given upon approval of the documentation submitted.

\$500 Teacher of the Year Award: Nominate A Local Teacher By April 3, 2023

K-12 Teachers are a national treasure; the job they have to educate our youth is at times challenging but very rewarding. Teachers help shape the future of our country by the lessons and principles they teach to the youth who sit day after day in their classroom. The American Legion knows some teachers teach about patriotism, Americanism, and the founding principles of the United States of America. We recognize that teachers spend their own money in the classroom and on their kids to make learning more enjoyable or easier to comprehend. Every year in The American Legion, the Department of Michigan recognizes five teachers working hard to impart those lessons to the children entrusted to them. We realize this is only a small gesture in the grand scheme of things, but we want to recognize them for their work.

Posts are asked to work with their local schools to help locate a teacher that fits the criteria to be nominated for this award. Nomination forms are available on our website and are due by April 3, 2023. Student Trooper Program: \$500- \$1,000 Scholarships Available to Participants

Every year, high school students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades are selected to participate in the Youth Law Cadet Law Enforcement Program. The program's purpose is to allow male and female students to explore and experience the various aspects of law enforcement training. Students participate in daily calisthenics and receive training in firearms, self-defense, fingerprinting, K-9 handling, accident and criminal investigation, and state patrol car driving. Students stay at the Michigan State Police Training Academy in Lansing.

Program Dates: June 11-16, 2023

Application Deadline: April 10, 2023

Cost: \$475 per student, usually sponsored by an American Legion Post/Squadron/Unit or other civic organization.

<u>Eligibility:</u> Any boy or girl meeting the following standards who is going into 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in the Fall of 2022, and is a Michigan resident, is eligible to be considered for selection into the Student Trooper Program:

- (a) in good health and able to participate in physical activities;
- (b) possess a positive attitude and display respect for law enforcement;
- (c) average or above average academic record; 2.5 GPA and above; and
- (d) possess a level 2 drivers license (preferred, not required)

Scholarships: Four Scholarship Available

- \$500 Academic Scholarship
- \$500 Marksmanship Scholarship
- \$500 Orator Scholarship
- \$1,000 Student Trooper of the Year Scholarship

Boys State: A Civic Leadership Program

The American Legion Boys State program is a non-partisan, non-political mock government exercise. At Boys State, participants learn citizens' rights, privileges, and responsibilities. Its purpose is to awaken within the youth of our nation a sincere conviction that a well-informed, intelligent, and involved citizenry is vitally needed to protect and preserve our American traditions. The training is objective and modeled on the city, county, and state government structures. Boys State grows out of the American Legion's faith in our young people and its firm belief that the future leaders of our country should have the tools necessary to keep it: a deep appreciation of active citizenship, an understanding of democracy, familiarity with our American form of government, and the discernment to select – and to be – productive leaders.

When: June 18-24, 2023

Where: Grand Valley State University- Allendale, MI

Eligibility: Male high school juniors going into their senior year in the fall of 2023

Application Deadline: May 1, 2023

Cost (tentative): \$25 Delegate Application Fee plus \$400 Sponsor Fee; total \$425.

Sponsor: A sponsor can be an American Legion Post, Son of the American Legion Squadron, an American Legion Auxiliary Unit, but it can also be the boy's parents, a business owner, a school, or other organization like the Elks, Knights of Columbus, or a Moose club.

Scholarships:

<u>Samsung Scholarship:</u> limited to students between their junior and senior years of high school who attend the current session of either an American Legion Boys State or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program and are a direct descendant of a wartime U.S. military veteran who served on active duty during at least one of the periods of war officially designated as eligibility dates for American Legion membership. Up to \$10,000 scholarship awarded.
